We just replaced two valves on a critical transmission line

In January, Helix replaced two large-diameter valves (see photo) used to control the flow of water from our treatment plant in Lakeside to customers in La Mesa, Lemon Grove and Spring Valley. This critical water transmission pipeline is energy-smart, too. It delivers up to 24 million gallons of water each day to locations in the far west reaches of our service area -- all by gravity.

Treatment plant staff delivering 70% cost savings

In 2021, staff at Helix's R.M. Levy Water Treatment Plant embarked on a multi-phase upgrade of the plant's 20-year-old ozone generation system. When bids from contractors came in as high as \$3.5 million, they decided to perform the upgrades themselves with technical support from the equipment manufacturer, Veolia Water Technologies. Staff developed and completed a proof-of-concept pilot project in fiscal year 2020-21. They will complete the upgrade of the ozone power supply units and generators this year and replace the computer control system in fiscal year 2024-25. The final cost of the project is estimated at \$1.1 million -a 70% cost savings by utilizing in-house expertise.

What's ozone? When oxygen molecules are hit by bursts of electricity in an ozone generator, they split and regroup as ozone. Learn why we use ozone to disinfect our water and more about water treatment at hwd.fyi/ozone.
